We invite you to visit The Labyrinth. The labyrinth is an ancient symbol that relates to our wholeness. It combines the imagery of the circle and the spiral into a meandering but purposeful path. The Labyrinth represents a journey to our own center and back out again into the world. It is a metaphor for life's twists and turns and is an opportunity that creates sacred space to become present to "That Which Is Within." A labyrinth is not a maze. The way in, is the way out. There is no need to think about where you are going. Simply let the path guide you and find nourishment in the present moment.

There is no "right" or "wrong" way to walk a labyrinth. At the entrance, quiet your mind, open your heart, and step in. As you walk you might notice your breath or contemplate your own lifes journey. While walking at your own pace you may meet a fellow traveler, simply step aside and let them pass. When you reach the center; pause, look up and take in a moment of peace. Please also receive the gift of an ancient celtic symbol that some believe represents the sacred union of mind, body and soul. As you walk out, you might reflect on your experience and notice how you feel. Again, there is no right or wrong way to do this. Just the invitation to walk and see how your experience unfolds.
